

Resource Management Act 1991

The following application for resource consent has been received by Bay of Plenty Regional Council.

The application documents, including an assessment of environmental effects, can be viewed at Bay of Plenty Regional Council Office Whakatāne (5 Quay Street, Whakatāne) during normal office hours or on our website (<u>www.bopbrc.govt.nz</u>).

Nature of Application

The application is for the renewal of two existing resource consents (61321 and 61322) to extract gravel from the Waioeka and Ōtara Rivers.

Resource consent 61321 allows for up to 50,000m³ of gravel to be taken annually from the bed of the Waioeka River. The gravel is extracted from various gravel beds between approximately 1 km downstream of the State Highway 2 Waioeka River Bridge to the most upstream point at the Redpath Bridge.

Resource consent 61322 allows up to 50,000m³ of gravel to be taken annually from the Ōtara River. Gravel is removed from gravel beds approximately 1 km downstream of the State Highway 35 Ōtara River Bridge upstream to the junction of the Ōtara River and the Te Waiti Stream.

Gravel extraction is permitted under these resource consents for purposes of river management and to maintain a meander pattern for erosion and flood control.

Location

The extent of the Waioeka River included within the application is described as approximately 1 km downstream of the State Highway 2 Waioeka River Bridge adjacent to Ōpōtiki township upstream to the Redpath Bridge which is located approximately 1.5 km down Wairata Road off SH2 (Waioeka Road), NZMS 260 W15: 8531 4594 - NZMS 260 X16: 9002 1595.

The extent of the Ōtara River included within the application is described as extends from a point approximately 1 km downstream of the State Highway 35 Ōtara River Bridge (adjacent to the northern end of the Ōpōtiki township) upstream to the junction of the Ōtara River and the Te Waiti Stream, NZMS 260 W15: 8706 4723 - NZMS 260 X16: 9306 3742.
